

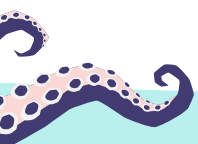
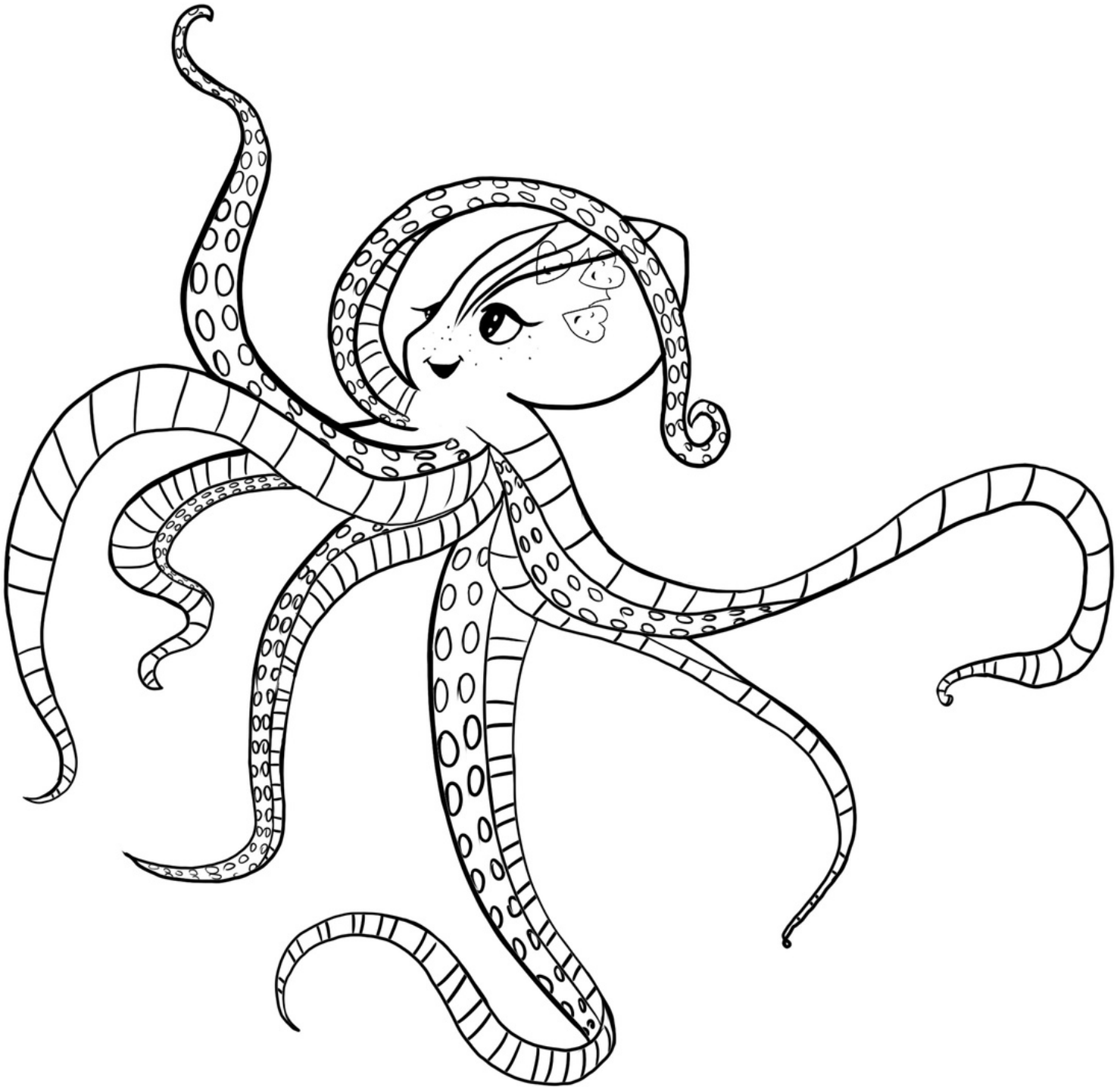


# Colour and learn!

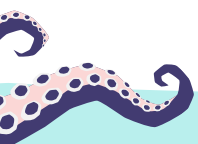
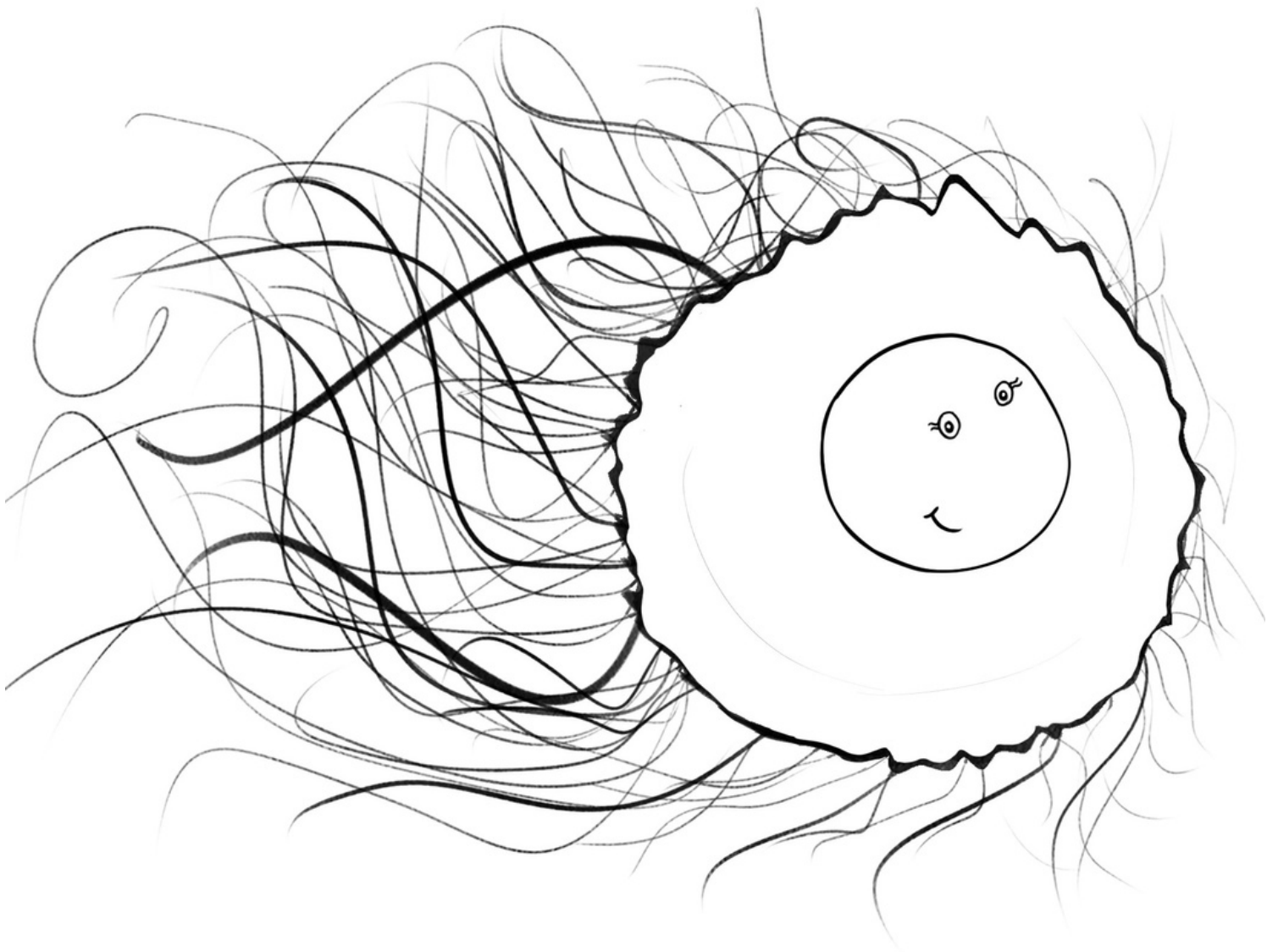


# Colour and learn!

**Fun fact:** This jellyfish is adapting so well to climate change that we may all be eating it in the future. Sunny side up on toast, please!



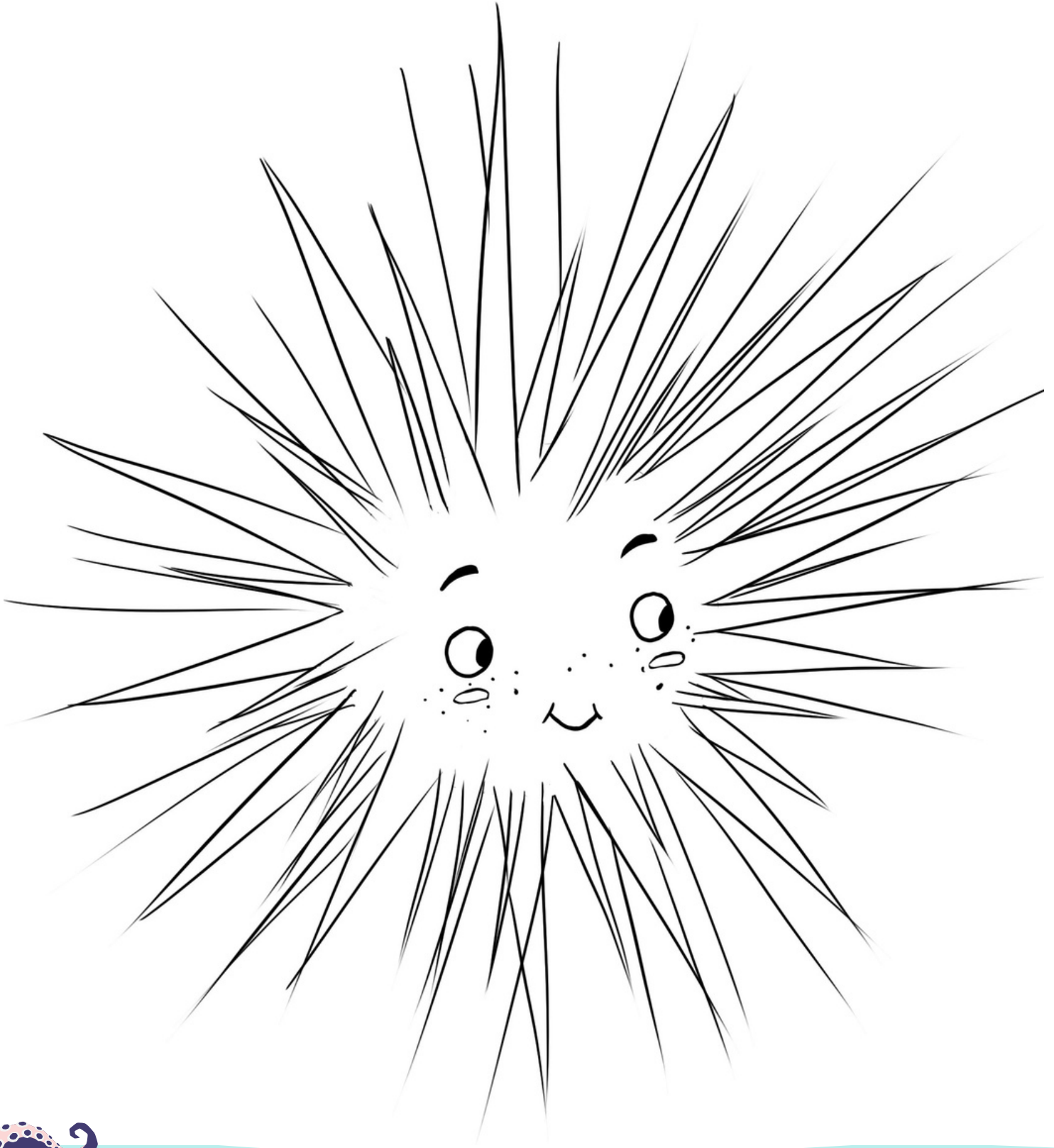


# Colour and learn!

**Fun fact:** Although it has no eyes, a sea urchin's body is covered in light-sensitive cells, making it like one big, spine-covered eyeball.



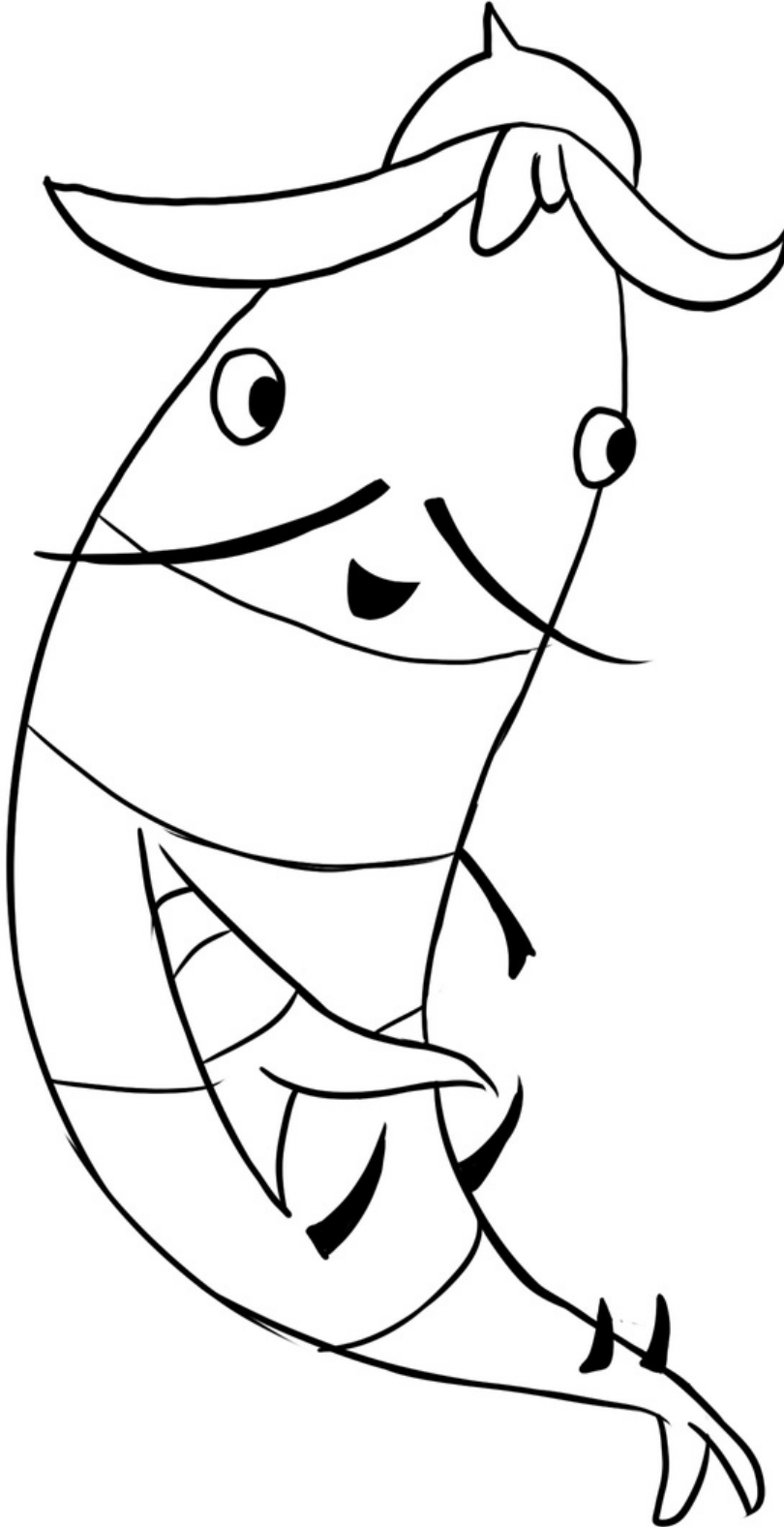


# Colour and learn!

**Fun fact:** When this tiny shrimp snaps its oversized claw the noise made can reach 210 decibels. That's louder than a lion's roar or a plane taking off!



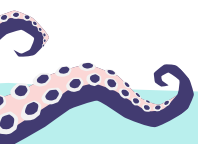
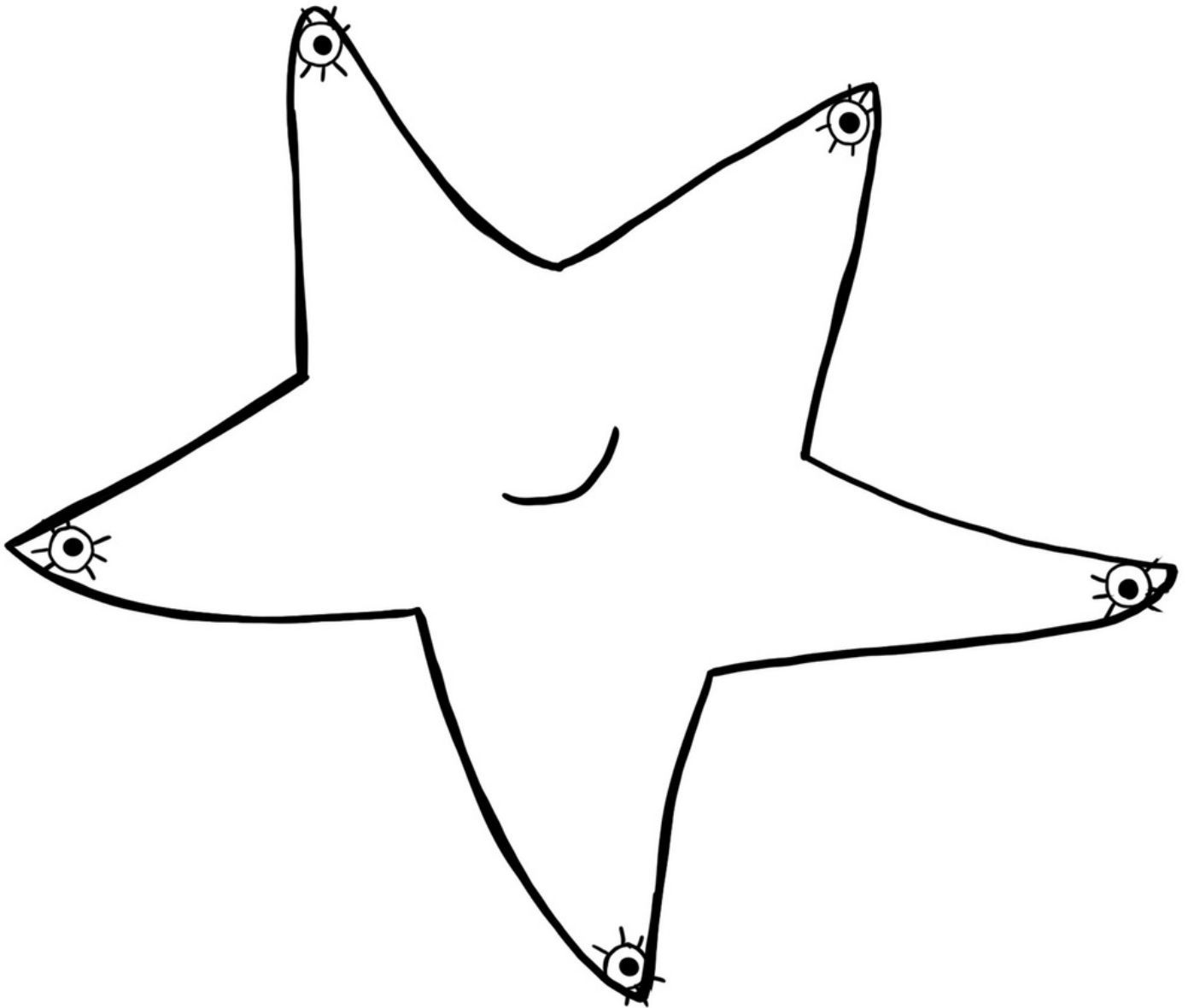


# Colour and learn!
